EMERGENCY KIT LIST

Check your kit for expired items and to update documents every June 1st to make sure you're prepared!

PERSONAL NEEDS

Ensure to have these items for each person

- Clothes and shoes (5 pair)
- First Aid Kit and First Aid Book
- Personal medication + medical devices (hearing aids, batteries, dentures, denture cleaner, etc)
- Mini toiletries (toothbrush, toothbrush, soap, hand sanitizer, deodorant, feminine supplies)
- Glasses, Contact Lenses and Cleaners
- Blanket or sleeping bag
- Poncho with hood for rain, umbrella
- Survival Whistle, Emergency Lights

FOOD & DRINK

Ensure to have these items for each person

- Non-perishable and canned food supply for 7 days
- 1 gallon of water per person per day for 7 days
- Manual can opener for food
- Food bars, Protein Bars, dried fruit
- Paper cups, plates, bowls
- Water filtration tabs, bottles, filters





EMERGENCY KIT LIST

Check your kit for expired items and to update documents every June 1st to make sure you're prepared!

MISC NEEDS

Ensure to have these items for each person

- Extra house and car keys
- Fire Extinguisher and Fire Blankets
- Cash and change in case ATMS are offline
- Books, games, cards, notebooks, pens / pencils
- Toilet paper, paper towel, wet wipes

FOR BABY

- Formula / food
- Clothing, blankets
- Toys, Stuffed animals
- Diapers, wipes
- Diaper cream, lotion, sunblock

FOR KIDS

- Books, toys, games, comfort items, notebooks, coloring books, crayons, markers, pencils, pens
- Clothing, shoes, hygiene items
- Blanket, pillow, charging devices, cell phones

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

- Identification (Drivers License, Military ID, Birth Certificate, Marriage Certificate, Social Security Cards)
- Written emergency contacts (insurance companies, family, friends, doctors, mortgage company, landlord, pharmacy, utility companies)
- Deed, Insurance Documents, Titles for Vehicles
- Financial Records, Current Utility Bills, Household Inventory
- Medical information: Prescriptions, allergies, insurance





EMERGENCY KIT LIST

FIRST AID KIT

- Medical Gloves
- Antibiotic Cream
- Cleansing Agent / soap and alcohol pads
- Burn Cream
- Variety of Bandages, Wraps, Ace Bandages, Gauze
- Bug Spray, Itch Relief
- Sunblock, Aloe, Sunburn relief cream
- Instant Ice Packs
- Adhesive Tape
- Tourniquet, Super glue, Liquid Bandage
- Cotton balls and Cotton swabs
- Eye wash and drops
- Thermometer
- Syringe, medicine cup, or spoon
- Petroleum Jelly or other lubricant
- Aspirin or non-aspirin pain reliever, Anti-diarrhea medication, antacid, Syrup of Ipecac, Laxitive, Antihistimine, Cough or cold medicine
- Plastic bags, assorted sizes
- Turkey baster or other bulb suction device for flushing wounds
- Sterile saline for irrigation
- Scissors, Tweezers, safety pins
- Hydrocortisone Cream
- First Aid Manual
- Finger Splints
- Arm sling



Keep important documents together in a folder that you can grab quickly if you need to be rescued or evacuate. If you do evacuate, take your emergency kit with you so you'll have essential items when you return home—especially if conditions are still unsafe or uncomfortable.

EMERGENCY KIT LIST

FOR PETS

- Food (wet, dry, flakes, seed, whatever your pet needs)
- Water for 7 days
- Food dishes
- Muzzle, collar, leash
- Immunization and veterinarian Records
- Identification Tag
- Current photos of pets
- Medicines: Daily, heartworm, flea & tick
- Pet bed and toys
- Pet Carrier
- Litterbox and Litter
- Puppy pads
- Proof of ownership / adoption records
- Waste bags
- Microchip information

TOOLS & ENERGY

- Lighters or matches
- Small flashlights (hand crank or solar power preferred to minimize need for batteries)
- Cloth or medical masks (3 pcs)
- Cell phone with solar charger
- Solar or hand crank power bank
- Small tools: Wrench, screw driver, hammer, rope, Multi-tool, utility knife
- Hand-crank or solar power NOAA Weather Radio
- Batteries
- Shovel, Tarp, Duct Tape
